How it is scored

What each criterion measures

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- **Claim** is worth 5 of the 25 points, scored across 5 levels.
- **Development** is worth 5 of the 25 points, scored across 5 levels.
- **Audience** is worth 5 of the 25 points, scored across 5 levels.
- **Cohesion** is worth 5 of the 25 points, scored across 5 levels.
- **Style and Conventions** is worth 5 of the 25 points, scored across 5 levels.
